- The relevance of your work for policy, practice, or future research.

**Important Guidance:** Use person-centred and non-stigmatising language (e.g., “person with lived experience of suicide”, “death by suicide”, “suicidal thoughts or behaviour”). Follow international best practices on responsible communication about suicide to minimise risk of harm. All research involving human participants must mention ethical approval and safety measures where relevant. Declare any conflicts of interest.
